Benefice of Needham Market with Badley. We welcome Tracey and her family and hope they settle in quickly.

A few conversations of late reveal that there is some confusion about The Mix provision in Needham Market. So, I thought I'd take this opportunity to explain. The Mix is a Stowmarket based charity providing a variety of services for young people. For some years now Mix youth workers have run weekly 'detached' sessions in Needham Market. This means they visited and provided activities on Crowley Park, usually on

Fridays. The Mix were keen to extend their provision here and the Town Council pledged to support this – hence the extension of the cricket pavilion on Crowley Park providing a permanent indoor/outdoor base, now named the Mix Hut.

The Mix Hut opens on Friday evenings (term time) 5pm till 7pm for children in school years 7-11. During school holidays there are longer sessions weekly.

The Mix are currently recruiting staff and hoping to provide a second evening session each week. The Mix would like to do

more in Needham Market and this partly depends on recruiting more volunteers to help run the sessions. We currently only have one volunteer in Needham Market – if you are interested in finding out more, please do make contact with me and I will put you in touch with that volunteer for a 'no pressure' chat about what is involved. Alternatively, contact The Mix direct or I'd be happy to pass your details on. Contact details are on page 2 of this Newsletter.

I need a new car for work but I can't afford to buy a new one so I've been looking at second-hand options. I've heard so many horror stories about people buying cars that turn out to be faulty. I'm worried that I won't know what to check, especially as I know very little about cars. How can I make sure I don't buy a dud car?

For many people, buying a car is a major purchase and whether it's new or second-hand, the process can seem daunting and complicated.

First of all, where are you going to buy the car? If you're buying from a trader, choose a trustworthy one with an

established name with a good reputation. Ideally, they will be part of a trade association or follow the industry's code of practice.

If you're buying via an auction, this is much riskier as you'll have fewer legal protections like the right to returns or refunds, so carefully read the terms and conditions before you bid.

If you buy from a private seller, there's a few extra steps to take. For instance, try to inspect the car at their home address so if something goes wrong later, you have a record of that.

Make sure the car's details are correct by using the DVLA's free online vehicle information checker. You'll need the registration number, MOT test number, mileage and make/ model of the car to do this check. Also, check the car's MOT history for free on gov. uk/get-vehicle-information-from-dvla.

Keep a copy of both these results (take a screenshot or download the information) as well as the original advert or description of the car. You might also consider getting a private history check to see if the car's been reported stolen, still has money owing on it, or has been in a serious crash. This will cost about £20.

Inspecting the car is crucial before buying. Ideally, do this during the day when it's not raining (scratches are harder to see on a wet car) and take it for a test drive for at least 15 minutes and on different types of road, if possible. Check you have the appropriate insurance for a test drive (either your own or the seller's policy might cover you).

Don't be afraid to haggle on the price, and only pay what you can afford. Make sure you get the original (not a photocopy) of the log book and valid MOT test certificate. Never buy a car without the log book. Often, despite doing all these checks, you might find something wrong with the car after you've bought it. You may have a legal right to a repair, the cost of a repair or some money back but it's on a case-by-case basis. If something has gone wrong with your car and you need help, you can call the Citizens Advice consumer helpline on 0808 2231133.

crime numbers to enable us to make a claim on our insurance. Ironically, just the other day, a lady on Nextdoor Needham was complaining that goods had been stolen from outside her house on two occasions, just one week after the other. Then, on Police Contact, we read that 2 chain saws had been stolen from a van parked on the Barking Road, not far from the Coop store. 2 minor crimes, that unfortunately, are going to take up a great deal of time for the police to solve. Sadly, it's something that should not have happened. If we just take more care and responsibility in protecting our property. It's well known that the professional or opportunist thief will return is he thinks that there are easy pickings to be had. We all fall into bad habits, I've done it myself, cutting the front hedge with an electric trimmer, the phone rang and I left it lying on the lawn and went to look at my diary. One thing led to another and after 20 minutes or

so I suddenly realised I had left it on display. Fortunately, it was still there when I went back but I would only have had myself to blame if it had disappeared.

In many cases it's money lost. Insurance companies will not reimburse you if they find out that you have been negligent and in any case the excess is often more than the goods lost.

We must help each other if we want to keep thieves out of our neighbourhood. For instance, If you notice that your neighbour has left their car windows open with bags on display on the back seat, I'm sure they wouldn't mind if you gave them a ring to let them know.

The police are far too busy to be overloaded with petty crime that could and should be avoided.

'Etta wasn't able to see Father Christmas due to her being neutropenic (no immune system) but after an email to the Stowmarket Lions Club they arranged Father Christmas to stop outside on his rounds so she could meet him on his sleigh. It was absolutely magical Etta was extremely excited and it made our year. The Stowmarket Lions Club emailed us after and offered to help us , they've offered to purchase an armchair/sofa bed for Etta's room to enable us to cuddle her and be close throughout the long nights of sickness and medications. We can't thank them enough!'

Commenting on Community Services and the role it plays Lion President Bob Cuff said 'I feel privileged and proud to be leading this amazing group of people this year. They voluntarily give their time to raise money to support those in need. It is heartwarming to know that we are helping make people's lives that little bit better'.



Help Keep Cricket in Needham

The first recorded mention of Cricket in Needham Market is from 1744 so 2024 will be our 280th anniversary, making us one of the oldest still functioning Cricket Clubs certainly in Suffolk and indeed the Country, however sadly, it could also be our last.

During this season (2023) we had to concede our league fixtures and drop out of the Two Counties League structure as we could not get the commitment necessary to play each Saturday.

We have not however "folded" as a club and we have continued to work on and look after the square at Crowley Park ready for next year. We are also solvent and strong financially and have all the equipment required to play and maintain the square, so the whole infrastructure is in place to continue the tradition of cricket in Needham Market if there is the will and support to continue.

We are currently proposing that the Club should rejoin the league system at a lower level to provide competitive cricket at a standard that may be more encouraging for new players, and we are exploring playing mid week 20/20 games. There is also the possibility that we could play Sunday cricket instead if that's what's wanted. We also plan to continue our successful "junior" cricket sessions on Friday evenings.

However, to do any of these things we need a structure behind the club and the commitment of players (of all abilities) to play during the 2024 season.

Can you help? Firstly and above all, we need players of all abilities to join and play. ECB rules say that you must be at least 13 tears old to play "senior" cricket but there is no upper age !!!

We will also need more volunteers to help with the "juniors" on a Friday night. If you want to take that on to a further level "coaching" courses are available that we will fund.

Not to put too fine a point on it, we need YOU.

Over the winter if there is a ground swell of opinion we will be "hold" an open meeting to discuss the best way forward but in the meantime PLEASE get in touch with either myself (andy.e.burgess@btinternet.com or 07879802114) or via our Needham Market CC Facebook page if you are interested and what the favoured options are Saturday/Sunday? We will then keep



you informed as to what is happening in readiness for next season. Including indoor net sessions during the winter period.

Armistice Day Commemoration, Remembrance Service and War Memorial Commemoration Service 2023

The annual Services will be held as follows:

Saturday 11th November – a short Armistice Day Service will be held at Barretts Lane Corner commencing 10.50am.

Sunday 12th November – Remembrance Service at Needham Market Community Centre, School Street commencing 10:35am (please arrive by 10.25am to enable seating allocation).

Sunday 12th November – following the Remembrance Service there will be a Commemoration Service at the War Memorial which is within the Town Burial Ground, top of Barretts Lane.

All the Services will be led by Reverend Tracy James, newly appointed Rector at St John the Baptist Church in the High Street.

All members of public are welcome to attend the Services. There will be a minibus available to take those with limited mobility who, following the Remembrance Service, wish to attend the Commemoration Service, from the Community Centre to the Burial Ground and back. Light refreshments will be available to the congregation at the Community Centre following the Remembrance Service and for those who return from the Commemoration Service.

Grants received for the Scout Hut Project and Younger Children's Play Area, Crowley Park.

Mid Suffolk District Council has approved Community Infrastructure Lavy (CIL) grant funding of £75,000 and £65,560 respectively towards the above projects. The Children's Play Area equipment installation works will commence on site by the end of September. The Scout Hut Project is considerably more complex and a start on that will made as early in the new year as is practicable.

Civil Parking Enforcement

Just a reminder to vehicle drivers regarding the regulated onstreet parking in the High Street and Barretts Lane. Since the introduction of Civil Parking Enforcement, when powers were transferred from the Police to local authorities to enforce parking regulations, many people have been caught out by overstaying beyond the time limits which are displayed. Parking enforcement in Mid Suffolk commenced on 6th April 2020 which was initially low key being within the COVID19 period. The District Council does not carry out enforcement itself but has contracted Ipswich Borough and West Suffolk Councils to manage it on their behalf. The Mid Suffolk enforcement areas can be seen on Suffolk County Council's parking enforcement map. The Town Council provides some off-street parking off the High Street and Barretts Lane, which remains free to use although users are asked to respect the two-hour limit where that applies.

Weed and general overgrowth across the town

The summer period and now beyond has seen a pattern of weather that has produced exceptional growth of plants and weeds. The Town Council focuses its very limited resources on keeping its recreation and play spaces free of overgrowth but that has been a struggle over the past few months, not helped by recruitment problems experienced by our main contractor Vertas. The days of proactive approaches by the District and County Councils are long gone, as their budgets have been squeezed and their drawing back from carrying out, what are for them, discretionary services.

What can be frustrating and sometimes dangerous is when hedges are left by homeowners to overgrow pavements, particularly on busy roads and school routes. The homeowner will invariably maintain their inside border hedge but completely neglect the exterior, which they are of course responsible for. They are creating a risk that could lead to public injury and the Town Council therefore appeals to those who have let the overgrowth happen, to take responsibility and deal with it.

Graham is also the current Local Recorder and takes responsibility for seeing that the present is adequately recorded at local level, and being on the look-out for items of historical interest which might be overlooked or lost for ever.

He was very ill, in fact terminally ill, which he didn't talk about very much, but he got very tired; and he asked if she might visit an old lady on his behalf who he usually visited as part of his pastoral work.

So she visited this old lady, who lived with her grown up daughter, and they had a teenage lodger, lan who had just come to work in Hounslow. The old lady and her daughter were very kind to him, but he hadn't made any new friends his own age, and he looked lonely and sad. So she said to him there is a small group of us who go up to central London on the tube every Sunday evening to listen to various famous preachers from different church denominations each week; and would lan like to join us? and he said 'Yes'. Well the first evening we all went with lan it happened to be Tom Rees, the Evangelist. At the end of the service he asked if anyone felt they had been called to further commitment, if not that evening then in previous weeks. So she went forward, and then a girl called Diane from their group, and finally lan.

After that she said to lan, apart from this small group, there is a larger group of young people who meet in each other's homes on a Sunday evening after church. So lan joined that group. and he met a really lovely young girl called Carol, and in time lan and Carol got engaged. Both young Christians. So from lan being a very unhappy lonely young man, it was wonderful seeing him absolutely radiant with happiness. Archbishop William Temple said "When I pray coincidences happen."


