News from the Parish Church of St John the Baptist

Hello, I started as the new Rector of St John the Baptist at the beginning of September. As I write, I've been in place for four whole weeks! I am settling into Needham Market and getting to know people – please do say hello if you see me wandering around.

In the church, the beginning of November is when we focus on remembering; first of all the Church celebrates All Saints day when we remember all the saints throughout Christian history – those remembered on a particular day throughout the church year, and those unknown. Then we remember those loved ones we no longer see on All Souls Day, we take time to give thanks for the good times and perhaps share memories of them. We have a service on 2nd November at 7.30pm where we can light candles and read out names of those we mourn.

Just a little way into November, we remember again the ultimate sacrifice made by so many people during the First and Second World Wars and many conflicts since. Our Remembrance service is at the Community Centre where the names of those lost in conflict will be read aloud. There will be well-known names still represented in our town and others long forgotten. Sometimes a name jumps out at me, and I wonder what that person's life was like, I wonder how the person lived, who they were to the people they knew, if they left a wife, sweetheart or family behind. We must never forget to tell their stories. We need to tell the generations to come about those who came before and not leave them simply reduced to a name on a memorial.

The Bible tells us that all Christians are saints, not just those who are famous in history and have 'St.' in front of their names, and so I am left pondering about us, this present generation. What will our stories be, when the time comes for them to be passed on? At some point in the future, we may well be names on a memorial stone or book of remembrance. What will people remember about us?

As we remember saints, souls and soldiers let us remember their stories, their courage, their kindness and may our stories

All Saints Day, November 1st

In the 8th century Pope Gregory III (731-741) designated November 1st as a time to honour all the saints. The evening before this was known as All Hallows Eve and later Hallowe'en.

The dictionary defines a saint as 'a very holy or virtuous person; a person venerated after death as a holy person.' Sometimes we may say 'Oh, you're a saint, thank you,' when some-one has done something exceptionally kind and selfless for us.

This hymn by John Bell and Graham Maule summarises the lifestyle of people who became saints:

For all the saints who showed your love in how they lived and where they moved, for mindful women, caring men, accept our gratitude again.

For all the saints who loved your name, whose faith increased the Saviour's fame, who sang your songs and shared your word, accept our gratitude, good Lord.

For all the saints who named your will, and saw your kingdom coming still through selfless protest, prayer and praise, accept the gratitude we raise.

Bless all whose will or name or love reflects the grace of heaven above. Though unacclaimed by earthly powers, your life, through theirs has hallowed ours. SN

Home Worship

Kate Dines, one of the founder members and organisers of St. John's Pantry, came to tell us about it at our September HOME WORSHIP.

She said the Parish church had been talking about setting up a food bank for sometime and then we got a new curate, Rev. Sarah, who had been given a sum of money for charitable purposes and she used this to help set up St. John's Pantry.

The food is obtained from a charity called 'Fair Share' who receive it from supermarkets, but also donations of food from local harvest festivals and collections in a box at the back of the Parish Church.

St. John's Pantry is open every Thursday morning from 9.30am at the 'Ark', i.e. the Parish Church Hall, King William Street. There is always a queue so please be there early.

At first we had large trestle tables with crates of food in the main hall, and two little card tables for free tea and coffee to drink. But then we were able to use the smaller room for the food and the main hall for the large trestle tables to serve tea, coffee and lovely home made cakes etc., which Lucille has donated.

The helpers are all volunteers, and there is a rota. It costs \pounds 3 for a large bag of food and anyone can come to obtain their bag and choose what they would like. Some items may be in short supply.

It is a very happy morning with people enjoying a friendly chat with each other over a cup of tea or coffee.


